On a perfect summer day about 300 people attended, mainly small children. They were entertained by storytellers, Russell Barrett (Librarian) and Anja Lee of the Friends who also led singing and oversaw coloured paper folding and running around a small rope lap game. This absolutely proved the asset the City of Hobsons Bay has with these Gardens. For the Friends of Williamstown Botanic Gardens it is a great start for our aim to have every Williamstown child to know and love the Gardens.

All credit to Anja Lee of the Friends of Williamstown Botanic Gardens who initiated and created the original idea for this activity, Jenelle Colston-Ing, Hobsons Bay Libraries, Children and Youth Team Leader who incorporated it into the Hobsons Bay Council's School Holiday Program.
