April was a busy and successful month for the Friends of the Williamstown Botanic Gardens.

There were three major events.

## General Meeting

 Monday 4th April 2011This first event was a talk by Richard Barley, Chief Executive Officer of Australia's Open Garden Scheme and former Director of the Royal Botanic Gardens.

This was most entertaining and stimulating, covering the historical context of botanic gardens in Victoria, their contemporary and future roles and also Australia's Open Garden Scheme. It was accompanied by an excellent digital slide presentation

Richard first talked of the establishment of the Royal Botanic Gardens Melbourne in 1846 under the curatorship of Ferdinand Von Mueller. He then discussed the major changes to the Gardens when Guilfoyle was appointed curator using slides to illustrate the differences. He showed a map of the large number of Botanic Gardens established in Victoria in the 19 th century where exotic trees were planted to determine what species would acclimatise. Interestingly he told us that the stock for elms in Melbourne came from English elms which had originated in Turkey.

He showed us the Children's Garden in the Royal Botanic Gardens with the delightful bronze sculptures of the main characters from Norman Lindsay's Australian children's classic "The Magic Pudding" at the entrance. The placing of the sculptures led to support for developing the Children's Garden which has been a great success with people of all ages. Richard made the point that Botanic Gardens need to evolve not just remain static.

Moving on to Australia's Open Garden Scheme Richard described it as a not for profit organisation whose aim is "To promote the enjoyment, knowledge and benefits of gardens and gardening in the Australian community and to build strong public support for the development of gardens across the nation."
